This competition not only promotes creativity but also aims to elevate awareness and appreciation for the vital role that community trees play in sustaining our environment and enhancing our overall quality of life. We look forward to witnessing the imaginative expressions of young minds as they visually celebrate the significance of trees in our communities. **Our 2024 theme is Trees for Wildlife Habitat.**

This year the grand prize-winning student will receive a **prize package worth over \$2,500** including professionally framed original artwork of their winning poster and other supplemental prizes. Once the grand prize winner is selected, they will be notified and there will be a recognition ceremony to celebrate their achievement. The winning student's teacher, principal, family members, Colorado State Forest Service representatives, contest sponsors, Colorado Tree Coalition members and members of the community will all be invited to participate in the celebration.

All winning posters from each school will be on display at the Denver Botanical Gardens (DBG) between 4/16-5/4. The first (20) submissions will receive (4) FREE passes to DBG to be held at will-call during this timeframe.

2024 CONTEST RULES

The 2024 contest theme is *Trees for Wildlife Habitat!*

Deadline for submitting posters is March 29, 2024. Please note that all posters must be received before this date. Any poster received after this day may not be included in the contest.

Theme Design Guidelines

Students will create a poster that reflects their ideas of "Trees for Wildlife Habitat" and the important role they play in the environment and in our quality of life.

Eligibility Requirements

Fifth grade students residing in Colorado.

Submission Requirements

- ONLY one poster per school shall be submitted. Each school/classroom is to decide on the
 best poster for the entire school. The individual winner should then be submitted to the
 contest.
- One entry per student.
- Must be original artwork created by a 5th grade student.
- Entries should be done on 12" x 18" paper or as close as possible to that size.
- The poster must relate to the contest theme. "Trees for Wildlife Habitat" must be on the poster; all words must be legible and spelled correctly.
- Entries may be done in marker, crayon, paint pens, watercolor, ink, acrylic, colored pencil, and tempera paint.
- Entries must be done on paper, which allows for duplication, display, and framing.
- ALL of the following information must be printed on the back of the poster: student's full name, grade, school, teacher's name, phone number, and email.
- Please avoid rolling artwork and keep posters as flat as possible during shipping.

Special Note: Entries become the property of the Colorado Tree Coalition and may not be returned.

Not Accepted

- Collages. Please do not glue anything on your poster.
- Computer or photo-generated art and printing.
- Matted, mounted, laminated, framed, or folded entries.
- Names of commercial products, companies or organizations should not be displayed.
- Artwork completed by more than one artist.


